# Brevī shortly

**Fīniētur** it-will-be-ended, it-will-be-finished. Note that in English this phrasing has two possible senses, and the difference is a little bit subtle: (Sense 1) At some future point it will be in a condition of 'finished', that is at some future point it will be over and done with, which is the sense that I think most people would assume is meant. (Sense 2) The meaning here, as this verb is used in Latin, is the future tense of a passive verb. We don't know who is doing the action of ending or finishing off, and we are not talking about a future state of being. We're talking about something (in this case our life) having an action done on it in the future.

You can perhaps see the difference better in a present-tense example: *It is torn*. Look how there's a different sense in the two ways of using this verb: (1) She can't read the address, because the envelope <u>is torn</u> (linking verb plus predicate adjective, which also happens to be a participle). (2) Here's how to make ramen noodles. First, the packet of noodles is removed from the box, and the flavoring packet is removed from the box. Next, the packet of noodles <u>is torn</u> open and the flavoring packet <u>is torn</u> on the dotted line. Next, blah blah blah. ('Is removed' and 'is torn' are examples of the present passive form of a verb. In this case 'is' is a helping verb, not a linking verb.) Do not worry if you don't understand this. It is not crucial for right now.

#### Venit mors velöciter
