Week 2. Historical and Artistic Background. Part 2. Pre-Hispanic Peru

Objectives. Students should be familiar with:

- Overview of the history, and scholarly periodization of, pre-Inca cultures in Peru
- History (e.g., origin, expansion), politics (e.g., kingship, administration), and religion (e.g., gods, huacas) of the Inca culture
- Several artistic media used in pre-Inca and Inca Peru

A. Pre-Hispanic Peru: Historical Background through the Early 16th Century

A1. Historical background: Pre-Inca

Historical Period I. Early Horizon Period, 1400-400 BC (cultures: Chavín, Paracas)
