The World After Covid: Prospects, Dangers, Temptations Lecture One Which Century Are We In?

News of the Week! This morning the Kremlin announced that President Vladimir Putin is self-isolating after several members of his entourage tested positive for Covid-19. In fact, Putin has been living and working in semi-seclusion for months, since before the pandemic erupted



Russia's vaccine diplomacy has targeted African and South American countries, with its Sputnik V vaccine both imported and manufactured locally under license



China has pursued a similar policy with its Sinovac vaccine



Russia was the first country to introduce a Covid vaccine, but its success in fighting the pandemic has been at best mediocre. According to Russian government data, 86M doses have been administered, 39.8M people are fully vaccinated = 27.6% of the population. I stress: these are official figures



China: 2.04B doses given, 889M people fully vaccinated = (possibly) 77% of the population. Herd immunity (80%) by the end of the year?



North Korea: no data. Dear Leader Kim Jong-Un, however, has become much more aerodynamically shaped



Germany: doses given 104M, fully vaccinated 51.7M = 62.3%. Angela Merkel, who is retiring later this month, can look upon this achievement with satisfaction



France: 91.5M doses given, 42.6M fully vaccinated = 63.6%. These are impressive numbers in a country with a tradition of health-related conspiracy theories




United Kingdom: 92.5M doses given, 44M fully vaccinated = 66.1%. These figures explain the continuing popularity of Boris Johnson's Conservative government. Earlier today it was announced that booster shots will be offered to all over-50s during the next few months



United States: 381 doses given, 179M fully vaccinated = 54.5%. We all know the story...



Worldwide: 5.76B doses given, 2.37B fully vaccinated = 30.4%



These world leaders' Covid score cards are a work in progress. In our course, we shall focus on the interplay between political power, including power of a highly personalized kind, and the pandemic













In history, positive- or negative-outcome fortuity is common








