- 1989 Cold War Ends. Fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989.


Agrippina Vaganova (1879-1951) Artistic Director of the Kirov Ballet

Mariinsky Ballet

Formerly (1935–91) **Kirov Ballet**, its predecessor, the **Imperial Russian Ballet**, founded in St. Petersburg in 1738.



Mariinsky Theatre, St. Petersburg, opened in 1860.

Bolshoi Ballet, its predecessor, the Petrovsky Theatre, established in 1773 in Moscow.



Originated as a dance school for an orphanage.

The Bolshoi Theatre was built in 1821 in Moscow, Russia



Rudolf Nureyev (1938-1993) Principal Dancer of The Royal Ballet. Director of the Paris Opera Ballet (1983-1989) Defected from Russia in 1961.





Timeline of Ballet in USA in 1900s

- 1910 Chicago Opera Ballet, America's first ballet company
- 1933 Bolm founds the San Francisco Opera Ballet.
- 1933 Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo
- 1933 School of American Ballet by Balanchine and Kirstein in Hartford CT, after several name changes, becomes New York City Ballet.
- 1937 Mordkin founds Mikhail Mordkin Ballet, the beginning of American Ballet Theater
- 1953 Robert Joffrey founds Joffrey Ballet in Chicago.
- 1969 Dance Theatre of Harlem, New York City, founded by Mitchell and Shook.

George Balanchine (1904-1983) Co-founder and balletmaster of the New York City Ballet,




choreographed more than 400 ballets. He is considered to represent the neoclassical style and is well-known for his modern-yet-classical, clean aesthetic.


Alvin Ailey Jr. (1931-1989) was an American dancer, director, choreographer, and activist who founded the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater in 1958.

Robert Joffrey (1930-1988) was an American dancer, teacher, producer, choreographer, and co-founder of the Joffrey Ballet, known for his highly imaginative modern ballets. He is credited with bringing a distinctly American approach to dance and with reviving experimental ballets from earlier eras.

Mikhail Baryshnikov (1948 -) is a Russian-American dancer, choreographer, and actor. He was the leading male classical dancer of the 1970s and 1980s. He became the artistic director at American Ballet Theatre 1980 - 1989.

TODAY'S VOCABULARY

<u>Arabesques</u> (ah-rah-besk) It is a position of the body, in profile. It is to pose on one leg while extending the other leg to the back. 1:17

<u>Développé</u> (dayv-law-pay') To develop. A movement in which the working leg is drawn up to the knee of the supporting leg and slowly extended to an open position en l'air. 0:42

Entrechat (, äntrə 'SHä) To jump in ballet, beginning in the fifth position, during which the dancer crosses his straight legs at the lower calf. Numerous rapid crossings. 0:59

TODAY'S VOCABULARY

Grand Battement (grahn baht-mahn) "large battement." To throw the working leg into the air from the hip and brings it back down to a position. 0:33

Mime (*maim*) The art of using the face and body to express emotion and dramatic action. 2:18

Relevé (rehl-leh-vay') Raised. A raising of the body on the points or demi-pointes. 0:27
