

- 1972 Widgery Report
- January 1973 marches memorializing the event begin
- January 1974 Bloody Sunday monument installed
- Late 1980s Bloody Sunday Initiative formed
- 1992 joins the Bloody Sunday Justice Campaign
- 1998 Saville Inquiry established by Tony Blair
- Judges heard evidence until 23 November 2004
- Saville Inquiry report published in 2010
- David Cameron's apology broadcast soon after










Eamonn McCann, journalist

- The basis for Greengrass's script
- Exposed lingering psychological effects for the first time

Five Minutes of Heaven Oliver Hirschbiegel, 2009








The Troubles: Resolution and Aftereffects

- 2008: Joe, Alistair, and a TV film crew



Surviving Trauma


- Psychic legacy and symptoms




Psychological Effects of Trauma in *Five Minutes of Heaven*
