Title: The Enlightenment

Course Description: In the years between 1650 and 1789, Europe produced a flurry of genius that transformed its culture, politics, and society. Science made rapid progress in biology, astronomy, and optics. Philosophy asserted its independence from theology. Learned societies developed, scholarly journals debuted. Refugees fled religious persecution, opposition to slavery intensified, and nations doubted whether kings were ordained by God. This was the Enlightenment.

This course will survey the Enlightenment from Descartes to the American Bill of Rights, highlighting its major figures and accomplishments. It will examine the controversies that heated the pursuit of happiness, freedom, and equality before the law.

Week One: God and the Church

After a brief introduction to the course, I'll introduce one of the most controversial issues of the Enlightenment: the status and power of the Church, and the Enlightenment figures who opposed it, especially Benedict Spinoza, Pierre Bayle, and Voltaire.

Week Two: King and Country

Week two will review the 17th-century monarchies of England and France (especially Louis XIV) and their critics. It will introduce Enlightenment reconsiderations of history and how it should be written. This week will feature John Locke, the *Encyclopédistes*, Montesquieu, and again Voltaire.

Week Three: Natural Law

Week three will detail Enlightenment contributions to science—astronomy, physics, botany, etc.—and the nascent human sciences—psychology, anthropology, and economics.

Week Four: The American Enlightenment

Week four will concentrate on how Enlightenment ideas were absorbed and enacted in the English colonies of North America. It will highlight the ideas that influenced the Declaration of Independence and the United States Constitution.
