

**Suggested activities for learning and retaining the material
from Session III of OLLI Latin, Fall 2020**

- Learn the vocabulary from “gaudeamus igitur, third verse”. Also, review the first two verses.
- Review the PowerPoint file OLLI 2020. ILAN. third session.
- Read the first and second lessons of *Principia*. In the *Exercitiōnēs* (ek-sair-kee-taah-ti-OWN-ace), which begin on p. 127 of the book, you could give a stab at 1(c), using the forms in the PowerPoint slide for eō, īre, ‘to go’ as a base. You could do most or all of lesson 2. Again, the exercises in 2(c) can be attempted using the same chart from the slides. We’ll fine-tune the forms soon. For now, don’t be overly fastidious about the vowels. If you see patterns, follow them. If you don’t, just plug in the forms from the chart. I need to make an answer key, which I will not have time to do for a few days. If you are really eager to get it, send me an email, and as soon as I’ve got it ready, I’ll send it to you. Otherwise, I will send it with next week’s OLLI downloads, *Deō volente*.
