

Homework from Session V of OLLI Latin, Fall 2020

- Review notes from the fifth session. These are in OLLI Latin, session V, PPT notes. I will be happy to provide the actual PowerPoint slides to anyone who requests them.
- Check your answers to last week's homework with the answer key to chapter three of *Principia*.
- Get yourself a blank copy of the noun morphology chart, and see how many forms you can fill in without looking anything up. You definitely get partial credit for remembering part of a form. Find a way to give yourself partial credit every time. This does not mean having no standards! This means giving yourself permission to let new content soak in gradually.
- Review all previous lessons of *Principia*.
- Check out Legonium.com if you haven't already. If pronunciation/listening is what you're looking for, check out dico-videos and season 1 videos.
- Make up some sentences using instrumental ablative. Your sentence can be as short as two words! One noun (singular or plural) in the ablative case, one active verb. You won't find an instrumental ablative in a sentence with a copulative verb, right? For verb forms, refer to the file *Principia exercitationes* ch. 3 from last week's homework. Remember the verb chart in there?
- Go back and read the previous installments in the *For your reading pleasure* series. Keep it in Latin as much as you can, paying attention to the morphology of each word as you read. You have two charts of morphology, one for nouns (a separate handout) and one for verbs (in the doc *Principia Exercitationes*, ch. 3). Keep these handy as you read, and refer to them as needed. This exercise should be done with Father Reginald Foster's approach of mastery at the beginning. N.B. There is as yet no new installment of *For your reading pleasure* this week. If I can get one done over the weekend, I'll send it to you. I need to be more careful about overextending you in these readings, which means that I have to spend more time putting it together.
