(3'0.30"-3.00" How to do Latin Hip Action. Figure 8 exercises.)

- Spine straight, shoulder low, long neck, arms to the side;
- Feet apart, transfer weight to one side, then side to side;
- Rotate hip back, then diagonal forward weight transferred;
- Rotate hip back, then diagonal forward weight transferred;
- Heels down, go figure 8.

- 1' Salsa:
 - side to side
 - back step
 - side two steps;
- 3:10' Cumbia:
 - step forward/backward
 - Step forward and step backward
 - candle steps.
- 4:44' Reggaeton/HipHop:
 - two bounces side to side;
 - destroy, use arms to pump;
 - hips tilt forward and back, pumping the arms;
 - stomping step forward

- 1) A Brief History

Jamaica: first Columbus/Spain ruled, then England, 1960 independence, English speaking, most African ancestry, Usain Bolt, Harry Belafonte.

Reggae: popular music of *Jamaican* origin that combines native styles with elements of *rock* and *soul* music and is performed at *moderate tempos* with the *accent on the offbeat*.

Reggaeton (The word *reggaeton* (formed from the word *reggae* plus the **augmentative** suffix *-tón*) Jamaicans who moved to Panama to help build the Panama Canal. Reggae eventually spread throughout the Caribbean. In Puerto Rico, it was

combined with North American hip-hop and dubbed reggaeton in the late 90s.
