Art of Spanish Colonial South America

Week 5. Regional Painting (Mid-17th to Early 18th Century)

Objectives. Students should be familiar with:

- the continuation and further evolution of the styles of the "three Italians" by their students and followers
- the expression of Afro-Peruvian culture in a portrait by the indigenous painter Andrés Sánchez Gallque
- the influence of paintings sent to South America by Spanish artists, such as Francisco de Zurbarán
- the impact of Flemish engravings on painting in Spanish colonial South America
- the work of painters in Quito in a mostly European style
- the production of paintings in series by Miguel de Santiago in Quito
- three critical events for the development of painting in Cuzco from the late 17th century
- the significance of the Cuzco Corpus Christi paintings, such as their expression of inter-indigenous rivalries
- the work of Cuzco painter Diego Quispe Tito, based on European models but adding local elements
- the work of Cuzco painter Basilio de Santa Cruz Pumacallao with its attention to European styles and the artist's connection to Bishop Mollinedo
