




Nancy Spero Mother and Children 2 1956



Homage to New York (I Do Not Challenge) 1959




The Great Mother Nancy Spero 1960












Nancy Spero Male Bomb I, 1966.





Nancy Spero Victims, 1967 Gouache and ink on paper 61 x 91.4 cm

Nancy Spero, Artaud Painting: This Crucible of Fire..., 1969. Gouache, ink and collage on paper.







Nancy Spero, Torture of Women, panel 7, 1976, gouache, typewriter collage, hand printing on paper




Torture today is essentially a state activity. ... the preconditing
